CHILD PROTECTION AND SAFEGUARDING POLICY

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with Safe Network guidance or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance. All changes will be communicated to our member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

CREATING SAFER FESTIVALS FOR EVERYONE

The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to provide **Safer Festivals** for everyone:

- 1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- 2. One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival. Name: Mrs. Julie Williams. J.Williams@rwbaf.onmicrosoft.com
- 3. Best practice advice in the form of **Safe Working Practice** and **Festival Child Protection leaflets**, with support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers. Including clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- 4. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending / performing at a Federation Festival.
- 5. All Festival personnel wear a lanyard to identify their roles. All teachers/parents/guardians/carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a Festival lanyard. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the **Safe Working Practice** and **Festival Child Protection** best practice advice. In addition, we will ensure the availability of a quiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 6. For the duration of a Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. The Festival cannot take any responsibility for property left unattended
- 7. No unauthorised photography, audio or video recording of children and young people is allowed at our Festivals. Where parents/guardians/carers do not wish photos to be taken at all, then the responsible adult attending should ensure that their child is not included in official photos.
- 8. Some children and vulnerable adults may have specific needs in order to take part. If this is the case, we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival Organisers prior to arrival. The Festival actively seeks wherever to meet these needs but must know beforehand in order to prepare support or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
- 9. The Festival's Child Protection Policy and approach to Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone is published explicitly in our Syllabus, Programme and Website. By completing and signing the entry form all parents / guardians / carers and teachers of entrants under 18 (or vulnerable adults of any age) confirm that they give (or have obtained) the necessary consents for the entrants to take part in the Festival. Without consent the entry to the Festival cannot be accepted.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILMING POLICY PLEASE NOTE

We recognise the need to ensure the welfare and safety of all children and young people taking part in our festival. In accordance with our Photographic Due Diligence Policy we will only permit official images of children and young people present at our festival to be taken by DBS cleared members of the Committee, such as the Social Media Team. The Festival is a public space and general photography is used to capture the spirit and success of the event. Individual photos may be taken with the written consent of the responsible parent(s)/carer(s)/guardian(s) concerned and by the child when over eleven years of age.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILMING IS NOT ALLOWED BY ANY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHILST PERFORMANCES ARE TAKING PLACE NOR WHEN ADJUDICATIONS ARE BEING GIVEN.

Photography by members of the public is allowed after classes have finished, however these must be taken in The Street. If you would like your child photographed with their Trophy by the official RWBAF Photographer, you will be asked for written consent by the official RWBAF Photographer.

We do not allow unofficial photography/filming to take place in privately owned spaces. Should an image of a child be put on our web or on Facebook with consent, they will only be identified by their first name. Images will then be destroyed as per our GDPR best practise. However, the artistic copyright of any images taken will rest with the officially registered photographer(s). At the same time, the festival also has the right to control how the images can be used which will be done by a written agreement with the photographer(s).

Anyone attending the festival (and entering a privately owned space) must comply with the festival policies (eg: photography / filming) set down by the festival. If a person fails to comply then they will be legally asked to leave as he/she will be in breach of these policies. Full details of our photography and safeguarding policies can be found on our website and are reviewed regularly to maintain British law is followed and safeguarding protocols adhered to.





EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES POLICY

This document is a statement of our policy for achieving equality of opportunity throughout the work of the Royal Wootton Bassett Arts Festival, its Committee members, volunteers, adjudicators, participants and any other stake holders.

This policy shall inform our actions and attitudes to all employees, sub-contractors, Trustees, volunteers and to members of the general public attending and participating at our events. We recognise that individuals and groups have been, and are, oppressed on many grounds including age, disability, sex, sexual orientation, marital or civil partnership status, pregnancy and maternity, race, colour, nationality, national origin, ethnic origin, political opinion, religion or belief.

The Festival will fully comply with the justifiable spirit of legislation in these areas and will aim to ensure that no person engaged or participating in our events is disadvantaged. We understand that equality of opportunity includes:

- Those attending and/or participating in our events
- The employment, training, recruitment and selection of employees, sub-contractors, Trustees, volunteers and Committee members
- How we communicate, both internally and externally, including how we portray
 participants in our events. employees, sub-contractors, Trustees and volunteers and
 everyone must agree to apply it in practice when working / volunteering for the Festival.

The RWBAF Committee is responsible for ensuring that this policy is implemented and will review this on an annual basis. For ethical and legal reasons we will not tolerate any unlawful discrimination or breaches of our Equal Opportunities Policy and appropriate action will be taken against offenders.

How we will deal with instances of negative discrimination

We are committed to taking action against all forms of discrimination. If you feel that you have in any way been disadvantaged, we urge you to report the matter to the Festival. Our first priority will be to investigate your concerns and seek to resolve the issue to your satisfaction. If you suffer from a disability (for the purposes of the Disability Discrimination Act) please inform us so that we can consider what reasonable adjustments can be made. We ask all our Festival Committee members, employees, sub-contractors, Trustees and volunteers to conduct themselves in a manner of which we can all take pride, and to accept their part in promoting non-discriminatory behaviour. We all have a duty to report such discriminatory behaviour, and to act in accordance with the spirit and the requirements of the relevant legislation. We do not, and will not, tolerate any form of discrimination. Appropriate action will be taken against anyone found to be acting in such a manner in accordance with the terms and conditions of their engagement as an employee, sub-contractor, Trustee, volunteer or member of the Festival Committee.

RWBAF DATA PROTECTION and PRIVACY POLICY

The Royal Wootton Bassett Arts Festival is run entirely by volunteers and registered with the Charity Commission (No: 1135906). It is a member of The British and International Federation of Festivals (BIFF).

What information do we collect about you?

In order to stage the Festival and manage its affairs RWBAF needs to collect and use personal data about individuals such as: competitors, their parents or teachers, RWBAF Friends, Volunteers, Adjudicators, Sponsors, etc., We collect information when you register through our online entry system to compete in the festival, apply to become a Friend of the Festival, or Volunteer to help at the Festival. We do not collect "sensitive personal data" unless there is a legitimate reason – where an entrant may need support to participate in a class.

Purpose of the Policy

- to ensure that RWBAF complies with data protection law and follows good practice.
- Protects the rights of all individuals whose personal data is collected by RWBAF.
- Is open about how it handles and uses individuals' personal data.
- Protects itself from the potential reputational and financial risks of a data breach.

Scope of Policy

This Policy applies to the Trustees of RWBAF, all Volunteers, Entrants, Teachers, Parents, Guardians and Carers as well as those working on behalf of RWBAF. We collect the names of individuals, their addresses, including email addresses, telephone numbers and information relating to individuals ie: date of birth, gender, school attended.

How will we use the information about you?

We collect information in order to process your entry to classes in the Festival and for administrative functions of the Festival. Access to this data will be restricted to RWBAF personnel. Personal data will be held securely and will not be passed on to a third party unless required to do so by law, but it should be noted that names of competitors will appear in the Festival Programme.

Access to your data and correction

You have the right to request a copy of the information that we hold about you. This can be obtained from the Festival Chair (e-mail: simcdowell@rwbaf.onmicrosoft.com). You may ask us to update or remove data if it is inaccurate.

Website and Online Entries

When you use our secure Online Entry System you will be directed to a suppler who will receive your credit/debit card number and contact information to process the payment fee(s). We do not obtain or retain your credit or debit card details.

Breach of Security

If anyone associated with RWBAF believes that a breach of privacy has occurred with any personal data held by RWBAF, he/she should notify RWBAF Trustees and provide details. The Trustees will investigate and take steps to prevent a further breach.



FESTIVAL GENERAL RULES

- 1. THE SAFEGUARDING POLICY is printed in this document and is on the website. It is also circulated to entrants to the festival. In the interests of child safety, all children must be accompanied by a parent or other responsible adult at all times.
- 2. STATUS: The Festival is open to all who do not make their living wholly or in part from the discipline entered.
- 3. AGE LIMIT: See each discipline section for clarification. These will be strictly observed.
- 4. CLOSING DATES FOR ENTRIES: 30th September for All disciplines. Late entries will incur a penalty of £2.00 an entry.
- 5. **ENTRIES** to be made using the Online Entry System accessed via the website: <u>RWBArtsFestival.com</u>. Entries will be open from 1st May. Please note paper and email entries are no longer accepted. All online entries will receive tickets via email. **Entry Fees must be sent with the entry. Refunds will not be issued once entries have been made.** In the case of hardship, please contact the Section Entry Secretary to ask about the Mary Champion Fund.
- 6. **FEES: Please make all payments by BACS** Bank details: HSBC, Sort Code: 40-47-16, Account: 11400479 with Ref: RWBAF and Invoice No. Cheques will no longer be accepted.
- 7. FRIENDS: Bank details: HSBC, Sort Code 40-47-16, Account: 11400487. Payments annually in January please.
- 8. **MUSIC / BACKING TRACKS:** Please note that backing tracks will be digital. CD's will no longer be an option. Further information will be sent after your entry has been submitted.
- 9. REQUESTS for specific times or days will be taken into account but cannot be guaranteed. If you cannot attend the Festival, please notify the Chair of the relevant Discipline as soon as possible.
- 10. CONFIRMATION will be sent detailing Venue, Class, Day, Time and relevant instructions concerning the festival to participants as soon as possible after the closing date for entries.
- 11. PRESENTATION: Participants are asked to think of their appearance as part of their performance and dress suitably i.e. casual but smart. Your performance begins when you leave your seat and ends when you return to your place.
- 12. PHOTOGRAPHY, VIDEO AND AUDIO RECORDING USING ANY DEVICE IS FORBIDDEN: The Festival is bound by Child Protection & Safeguarding Laws and Copyright Laws and cannot allow photography, tape or video recording during any performance or adjudication. The Press or an official photographer may be in attendance at the festival. Photographs will only be published with permission sanctioned by parents/guardians/carers at the time of Entry to the Festival.
- 13. MOBILE PHONES: These must be turned off during performances.
- 14. ADJUDICATORS: Alternative or additional Adjudicators may be appointed as necessary. COMMUNICATION WITH ADJUDICATORS IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED. THE ADJUDICATORS DECISION IS FINAL: Marks awarded by the Adjudicator will be in accordance with the new BIFF scheme. The festival awards a trophy and RWBAF Gold Medal to the person gaining the highest mark in the class, providing the mark is 84 or above.
- 15. TROPHIES: All Trophies remain the property of the festival and must be returned by 30th September of the following year. Trophies must be signed for at the Steward's Table. A Trophy may be engraved at personal cost. However, Mr. David Radway, Engraver, Apsley House Arcade, 50 High Street, RWB supports the festival by engraving trophies for free. Lost or damaged trophies must be replaced or repaired by the candidate.
- **16.** TIME LIMITS MUST BE STRICTLY OBSERVED: Failure to comply may lead to penalisation in marks. If the time is excessive the performance may be stopped. **Introductions are not included in the time limit.**
- 17. ACCOMPANISTS are permitted in most Vocal and Instrumental classes. See Singing and Instrumental classes for details. Accompanists are not permitted in Musical Theatre classes.
- 18. ORDER OF PERFORMANCE: Entrants must perform in the order given unless involved elsewhere, in which case, the STEWARD must be notified, and they will be re-called at the end of the class.
- 19. Performers are not allowed to reproduce work presented the previous year, except in Dance.
- 20. COMMITTEE'S RIGHTS: The Committee may combine classes where entries are small, divide classes where entries are large, and has the power to make other regulations or interpret or qualify any of these rules as occasion may arise.
- 21. SUBSTITUTION: No substitutions will be allowed after entry for Solo or Duo/Duet Classes, except in exceptional circumstances and by prior arrangement with the Committee. Substitutions are allowed in Group, Ensemble and Choir Classes.
- 22. COMPLAINTS: Please make any complaint to the Chair of the Festival in writing accompanied by a fee of £10.00 to cover administration costs, which will be returned if the complaint is upheld. The festival will inform the complainant of their decision within one month. If this outcome is not acceptable, the complaint may be taken up with the British and International Federation of Festivals, whose decision will be final. The Royal Wootton Bassett Arts Festival Vice Chair(s) will be able to supply the address
- 23. LOST PROPERTY: The Festival cannot accept responsibility for property left at venues during the event.
- 24. SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC: It is necessary for parents, teachers, and those responsible for children or disabled or those persons with additional needs to be aware of any limitations. Anyone requiring assistance must make this known at the time of entry.

- 4. The script must be submitted with a Title with the Name of Entrant(s).
- 5. The play must feature between a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 8 players.
- 6. The Time and Setting of Action must be included together with any sequences for introduction, non-copyright music, effects and closing credits.
- 7. A brief Synopsis and a list of featured characters must be included.
- 8. An indication of the kind of music to be used will suffice in place of named tracks which must, if from a published source, have proof of licence granted for use as part of a broadcast production.
- 9. All work submitted must be original and not previously published or broadcast.
- 10. The Theme and genre will be the choice of the originator and will be suitable for radio broadcast or online streaming to a general audience.
- 11. The General Rules of the Festival as published in this Syllabus will apply.
- 12. The script must be free from anything likely to offend against the laws of decency, racial, cultural or gender discrimination as commonly upheld, for example, by the BBC and commercial radio stations.
- 13. All entries will receive a Mark Sheet with comments.
- 14. The Western Players Radio Drama Trophy will be presented to the winner.
- 15. The trophy will remain the property of The Western Players to be held for one year. The winner may have this engraved.
- 16. Entrants who receive outstanding marks will receive a Certificate of Achievement.



- 1. Please see Festival General Rules, Child Protection Policy and the Safeguarding Policy.
- 2. The Festival is open to all who do not make their living wholly or in part from the discipline entered.
- 3. Entries to be made using the Online Entry System accessed via the website RWBArtsFestival.com. Entries will be open from 1st May. Please note paper and email entries are no longer accepted. All online entries will receive tickets via email. Entry fees must be sent with the entry. Refunds will not be issued once entries have been made. Payment by BACS only: HSBC Sort Code: 40-47-16 Account: 11400479. Ref: RWBAF and Invoice No. Cheques will no longer be accepted.
- 4. Age Limit: Entries as per School Year.
- 5. Closing date for entries 30th September. Late entries will incur a penalty of £2.00 an entry.
- 6. No instructing or mouthing of words by teacher, tutor or parent is allowed during performance. This and/or offstage direction may incur a penalty.
- 7. **Copies of all "own choice" pieces must be given to the Adjudicator** at the time of performance. Photocopies are permitted providing they are clearly marked **"Adjudicator copy. Destroy after use"**. The festival will be responsible for destroying all photocopies on the day of performance. See Rule 8.
- 8. BIFF require information on titles and authors of all Verse and Prose pieces performed at the festival. Copies will be retained after each class to collate a list before they are destroyed.
- 9. Taped music and/or sound effects may be used as a background to Mime, Acting, Devised, Group Speaking, or Senior Lyrical Verse and must be provided by the performer. Performers must supply their own equipment which cannot be plugged into the mains and must be battery operated by a teacher or fellow student. RWBAF Committee will not be responsible for using other devices.
- 10. For all Reading classes, books must be supplied by the Performer.
- 11. Props essential to the action may be used in Acting, Devised Drama, Choral / Group Speaking and Recital i.e: hat, scarf, stick, bag, fan, shawl etc., No breakable props or liquids to be used. Props may NOT be used in Mime classes with the exception of Group Themed Mime.
- 12. A neat appearance is expected at all times. No costume, but practice skirts will be permitted.
- 13. **Time Limits** will be strictly adhered to. **Introductions are not included in the time limit**. If the performance overruns this may be reflected in the final mark and may be stopped at the discretion of the Adjudicator.
- 14. Substitutions are NOT allowed after entry for Solo or Duo classes, except in exceptional circumstances, and by prior arrangement with the Committee. Substitutions are allowed in Group classes.
- 15. Performers cannot enter more than once in the same class.
- 16. Performers are not allowed to reproduce work presented the previous year.
- 17. Due to the juxtaposition of Classes, teachers and performers are requested to be sensitive towards the inappropriate use of language in texts.
- 18. No conferring with the Adjudicator is allowed and performers and their representatives may not communicate directly with an Adjudicator. The Adjudicator's decision is final.
- 19. In all Acting classes sketches are not permitted, except those set for exam syllabi, which must fit RWBAF timing. Scenes may be taken from any play or a dramatisation of a novel. In solo scenes ONE CHARACTER ONLY must be performed. GROUP ACTING must consist of three or more speaking parts.
- 20. Chairs and tables will be provided by the Festival. Please note changing facilities will not be available.
- 21.T.V. News Reading. The script will be sent two weeks before the Festival. Text to be read and not memorized. Entrants may be filmed with permission from parents/guardians/carers. Those being filmed will receive notification of the day, time and running order two weeks before the Festival. All must attend the class. If entrants have missed their film slot, they will present their work in person, last.
- 22. Public Speaking. A projector and screen will be provided. If used, please bring own laptop with HDMI port. Connection to the festival's projector is via an HDMI lead. Some laptops and devices such as MACs and iPhones/Pads require an adaptor to connect to HDMI. Entrants to supply their own.
- 23. Performers should note that the Festival has a zero tolerance policy towards any expressions of racism, personal abuse, defamation of recognizable individuals, swearing and explicit sexual references, or of any utterances likely to cause offence to the audience which might include minors under age 16.

- 1. The Festival is open to all who do not make their living wholly or in part from the discipline entered.
- 2. **Entries** to be made using the Online Entry System accessed via the website RWBArtsFestival.com. Entries will be open from 1st May. Please note paper and email entries are no longer accepted. All online entries will receive tickets via email. **Entry fees must be sent with the entry.** Refunds will not be issued once entries have been made. Payment by BACS only: HSBC Sort Code: 40-47-16 Account: 11400479. **Ref: RWBAF and Invoice No.** Cheques will no longer be accepted.
- 3. Age: As per Grade, or age as on 2nd September or School Year. See classes.
- 4. Closing Date for Entries 30th September. Late entries will incur a penalty of £2.00 an entry.
- 5. **Music / Backing Tracks:** These are permitted in most Singing Classes and Traditional Music Classes only. These are not permitted in Instrumental Classes. Please note that backing tracks will be digital. CD's will no longer be an option. Further information will be sent after your entry has been submitted.
- 6. No instructing by teacher, tutor or parent is allowed during performance. This and/or offstage direction may incur a penalty.
- 7. **Copies of pieces must be given to the Adjudicator** at the time of performance. Photocopies are permitted providing they are clearly marked: "Adjudicator copy. Destroy after use". The festival will be responsible for destroying all photocopies on the day of the performance.
- If your piece requires an accompanist and you cannot provide your own, please book this with our
 recommended accompanists page 40 by contacting them directly. It will not be possible to arrange an
 accompanist on the day of your performance.
- 9. The RWBAF PA System will be available with microphones for Singing and Traditional Music classes which entrants may use in classes where specified as an option.
- 10. Please enter at the level/grade you are currently playing / singing.
- 11. For classes with multiple entrants (Duets, Ensembles and Groups), the class entered will be determined by the age of the oldest entrant.
- 12. Performers may not perform the same piece in more than one music class.
- 13. Performers are not allowed to reproduce work presented the previous year.
- 14. Performers cannot enter more than once in the same class.
- 15. A neat appearance is expected at all times. Please announce your piece(s) clearly.
- 16. Please note that your performance begins when you leave your seat and ends when you return.
- 17. The Festival provides suitable pianos and music stands.
- 18. **Pianos:** Every effort will be made for pianists to perform on a Grand Piano. However, in the event of a large number of entries, the Committee may deem it necessary for a second piano to be used, and this will be a digital upright piano.
- 19. **Time Limits** will be strictly adhered to. **Introductions are not counted in the time limit.** If the performance over-runs this may be reflected in the final mark, and a performance may be stopped at the discretion of the Adjudicator.
- 20. **Substitutions** are NOT allowed after entry for Solo or Duet Classes, except in exceptional circumstances and by prior arrangement with the Committee. Substitutions are allowed in Ensemble and Group Classes.
- 21. No conferring with the Adjudicator is allowed and performers and their representatives may not communicate directly with an Adjudicator. The Adjudicator's decision is final.
- 22. The Adjudicator will mark and comment on each performance using the BIFF scheme. In the interests of preserving a high standard of performance, an award will only be presented to the winner of a class if they achieve 84 marks or higher.
- 23. **Trophies:** Trophies awarded for the Highest Mark out of a range of classes will only be awarded if two or more entries have been received.
- 24. Performers should note that the Festival has a zero tolerance policy towards any expressions of racism, personal abuse, defamation of recognizable individuals, swearing and explicit sexual references, or of any utterances likely to cause offence to the audience which might include minors under age 16.
- 25. Trophies to be returned by 30th September 2025.

- 2. The Festival is open to all who do not make their living wholly or in part from the discipline entered.
- 3. **Entries** to be made using the Online Entry System accessed via the website RWBArtsFestival.com. Entries will be open from 1st May. Please note paper and email entries are no longer accepted. All online entries will receive tickets via email. **Entry fees must be sent with the entry**. Refunds will not be issued once entries have been made. Payment by BACS only: HSBC Sort Code: 40-47-16 Account: 11400479. **Ref: RWBAF and Invoice No.** Cheques will no longer be accepted.
- 4. **Music / Backing Tracks:** Please note that backing tracks will be digital. CD's will no longer be an option. Further information will be sent after you entry has been submitted.
- 5. Closing date for entries: 30th September unless we have filled all spaces earlier. Late entries will incur a penalty of £2.00 an entry. Entries will be dealt with on a first come, first served basis. Once capacity has been reached no further entries will be accepted. Once accepted, no changes can be made.
- 6. No instructing of dance by teacher or parent is allowed during performance.
- 7. There will be changing facilities available for boys and girls.
- 8. **Time limits** will be strictly adhered to. If the performance over-runs this may be reflected in the final mark.
- 9. Substitutions are NOT allowed after entry for solo, duet or trio classes. Substitutions are allowed in Group Classical or Cabaret classes.
- 10. Performers cannot enter more than once in the same solo classes.
- 11. Due to the juxtaposition of classes, teachers and performers are requested to be sensitive towards the inappropriate use of language in songs.
- 12. Chairs and tables will be provided by the festival.
- 13. The committee has the power to combine classes where small and divide classes where too large.
- 14. Medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd places for a mark above 81. In the interests of preserving a high standard of performance, an award will only be presented to the winner of a class if they achieve 84 marks or higher.
- 15. **Age** will be reckoned as of 2nd September.
- 16. All performers should sign in on arrival.
- 17. Entrants will perform in the order determined by the committee and shown in the Programme.
- 18. Performers are marked in accordance with the British and International Federation of Festivals marking scheme in force at the time.
- 19. Performers to arrive in plenty of time as classes may start 30 minutes ahead of time.
- 20. No conferring with the Adjudicator is allowed and performers and their representatives may not communicate directly with an Adjudicator. The Adjudicator's decision is final.
- 21. No voice accompaniment on music for song and dance classes or tap sound effects on tap classes.
- 22. Ballet en pointe, is only allowed for age 13 and over. Teachers are responsible for ensuring that any competitors dancing on pointe are at a suitable standard.
- 23. One restart allowed for under 9's at the discretion of the adjudicator.
- 24. Only teachers allowed backstage unless large props are involved. For performers under 6, one adult may be allowed if needed.
- 25. All trophies should be returned in a good clean condition on or before 30th September of the following year. All trophies should be signed for by the recipient.
- 26. The festival is open to all non-vocational students or non-professional performers.
